The Dog CC went to Jill Cowper's Ch Graythor Augustus at Rothenborg with Miss L Brown's Graythor Captain Hook taking Res DCC.

In bitches the CC was won by Sally Simmonds & Maggie Mott's Ch/am Ch Kamgaard Klementina, beautifully handled by Sally. Res BCC was Barbara Barganska's Cealdstan Ancestral Voices of Barbelka .

Best Puppy was Ravenheim Kvikk Solv owned by Mrs C V & Mr M J Saint and Best Veteran was I believe, Simms' Ch Seasara Earl Grey. Please correct me if I'm wrong but Fosse Data had a huge glitch when the results website went down completely for a long time. It then came back saying that the puppy was Best veteran, then I was told the Bitch was Best Veteran. All very confusing!

Best of Breed then went to Kamgaard Klementina who really did the breed proud as she marched into the Group ring as if she owned it and never stopped showing for a second. People should pay attention to Sally's handling; no fiddling about or tweaking position or messing with the dog; just allowing her to stand naturally and show herself off then moving at the correct speed for an Elkhound without racing round the ring.
